

### Helen Dennis - 2014 Status of Women Awardee

Helen is a nationally recognized leader on issues of aging, employment, and retirement. She has been the recipient of numerous awards for her teaching at the Davis School at USC's Andrus Gerontology Center.

She is the editor of two books, *Retirement Preparation* and *Managing an Aging Work Force*, author of over 50 articles, frequent speaker and weekly columnist on Successful Aging for the Daily Breeze Newspaper Group reaching 1.3 million readers, and co-author of *Project Renewment*.

In her volunteer life, Helen has served as president of five nonprofit organizations. She was a delegate to the 2005 White House Conference on Aging and has served as an expert witness in large class action suits against age discrimination.

Helen has been extraordinarily generous to AAUW-PVP by donating her time and expertise. She was the main speaker of one of our community events, guided the exploratory meetings leading to the Village Concept Project and the formation of the Living Room discussion group. And finally she has acted as the main speaker and panelist for the Village Concept Community events at the Peninsula Center Library

They will assume their duties July 1, along with the other directors: Lynne Batchelor, Helene Carr, Cathy Foxhoven, Sue Miller and CFO Donna Mertens, as the AAUW California Board of Directors for 2014-2015.

The dues increase passed. **Thanks to all who cast their ballots**! The percentage of members who voted was 20.8%, a total of 2475 votes. That is a record number of votes and a tremendous increase over last year.
