## AAUW CA Election Results

Voting in the AAUW CA election closed on May 11, 2013 at 5:00 pm PDT. This was the first year of on-line voting and although it was anticipated that 20% of the membership would take advantage of this opportunity to have their vote registered, only 12.9% of the AAUW CA membership did actually cast a ballot which results in 1,563 members voting.

The election results are:

- The Public Policy Priorities for 2013-15 were APPROVED.
- The proposal to increase state dues by \$4 effective 2014-15 was PASSED.
- The proposal to amend the state bylaws to reduce the number of state directors from 16 to 12 effective 2013-14 was PASSED.

Because the bylaws amendment was passed, only four directors at large were elected and they are: Lynne Batchelor, Helene Carr, Cathy Foxhoven, Sue Miller. Other candidates elected were: Donna Mertens, Chief Financial Officer, and Kathleen Doty, President Elect.

## Branch to Approve 2013-14 Operating Budget

The new operating budget was approved by the Branch Council in July and is presented below for general membership review. At the September 22 meeting, members in attendance will vote approval. Questions regarding the budgeting process or any line item in the budget should be addressed to the Finance Committee (**Faith Morrow, Rowie Wolf, Sherry May**) prior to the vote.

#### Notes to the Operating Budget:

\* Actual income exceeded actual expenses. Therefore, \$228 allocated to income will be put back into the reserve fund.

\*\* The primary item in General Operating expense is insurance which we are required to take through AAUW-CA. This expense is close to \$500 annually.

\*\*\* The AAUW-CA convention in 2014 will be local. Therefore, several members are expected to attend. The \$1,000 allocation will be divided among those members attending the convention in 2014.

### Mary Frangias will be Missed

Long time AAUW member, **Mary Frangias**, passed away July 8<sup>th</sup>. Throughout the years Mary participated in Contemporary Literature, Classic Books, Great Decisions and WAWA as well as many of the branch programs. She also was a member of the League of Women Voters.

Mary graduated from University of Texas and Columbia University and had a career as a social worker. As a young woman she worked in Greece where she met her husband, Dennis. They spent many summers on the island of Cephalonia where he and his family had lived and Mary continued to travel widely throughout her life.

Members who knew Mary well offered the following comments:

*"We all benefited from her extensive life and reading experience."*

*"Mary was interested in many areas of public life and wanted to be informed. She participated in activities and meetings even during the years when that was difficult for her."*

*"She was such an intelligent woman with a quick mind and so well rounded in about any subject."*

*"Mary was a tough lady. She was so vital and so dedicated to the underdogs of this world. She wasn't afraid to remind us that many in the world were not as fortunate as we are. Mary showed enormous courage and stamina to attend our discussions in the past several years. She was so smart and alert about the status of the world. We will truly miss her voice in our future deliberations."*
