Author of three books and over 40 articles, frequent speaker and weekly columnist on Successful Aging for the Daily Breeze, LA Daily News and the Long Beach Press Telegram (reaching almost 1 million readers), she has assisted over 10,000 employees to prepare for the non-financial aspects of their retirement. In her volunteer life, she has served as president of five nonprofit organizations.

Helen is co-author with Bernice Bratter of the Los Angeles Times bestseller book <u>Project Renewment: The First Retirement Model for Career</u> <u>Women</u>.

Fully engaged in the field of aging, she was a delegate to the 2005 White House Conference on Aging and has had extensive experience with the media including Prime Time, network news, the Wall Street Journal, Sacramento Bee, Orange County Register and Christian Science Monitor.

From the Council Chair . . .

I've been thinking about AAUW Funds.

I recently received a printout showing that in addition to the modest \$2 of our annual membership dues that support the AAUW Funds, over 25 of our members made individual contributions last year. In addition, Readers Theater made a special gift.

We're making a difference in the lives of women and girls through our contributions to AAUW Funds. Last year AAUW provided more than \$4.3 million for more than 278 fellowships and grants. And more than \$100,000 support to plaintiffs in seven precedent-setting lawsuits, including the Wal-Mart pay discrimination cases and the military sexual assault cases.

I recently went to the national website to remind myself of what all the AAUW Funds include. I thought others might like to be reminded too. (AAUW Funds is the umbrella general fund which supports all AAUW's charitable work.)

- The Legal Advocacy Fund supports the protection of the legal rights of those who are facing discrimination, including case support. The new film, <u>The Invisible War</u>, features several cases of sexual assault/harassment in the military.
- **The Educational Opportunities Fund** includes fellowships and grants and supports educational and learning opportunities that give women a chance for a lifetime of success. Those who attend the spring Funds Awards Luncheon each year know how important this Fund is.
- **The Public Policy Fund** supports advocacy for public policies and laws that are fair to women. Last year's important voting initiative is an example of work in this area.
- The Eleanor Roosevelt Fund supports AAUW research to provide analysis, data and accurate information
 about issues that are important to women and girls. Past reports include <u>Behind the Pay Gap</u> (2007)
 and <u>Where the Girls Are</u> (2008), and most recently, <u>Graduating to a Pay Gap</u>. Upcoming reports will
 cover women and girls in science, technology, engineering and math and sexual harassment in the
 workplace.
- The Leadership Programs Fund supports programs that develop women's potential to lead in their schools, workplaces, communities and country. Leadership programs include the National Conference for College Women Student Leaders, Campus Action Projects and Elect Her.

After the video they used their own vehicles (toy trucks) containing passengers (raw eggs) protected by a variety of materials of their choice.

There were loud cheers when each of the eggs survived the crash. The father and daughter team of presenters were **Dick and Jessica Granoff**. Dick is a retired physics teacher and Jessica is a "cool" engineer who looks more like a high student than the accomplished professional she is. Their presentation was a total success.
