There is the same commitment to further the work of AAUW through supporting the association's programs and policies, through working in the community and beyond to address "social and civic problems," and in conviviality and having fun through interest groups and annual celebrations.

I've heard it said that changes do not affect reality on the deeper level. It makes sense that while the surface appearance and activities will change, the deeper reality remains. And we may no longer wear white gloves, but I believe we share the purpose and basic commitments of those women who founded the Palos Verdes-Rolling Hills AAUW branch back in 1957.

We were all touched as the parents told us how important this program was to their daughters and how this type of exposure to math and science and life on a college campus would make an impact on their futures.



Cordelia Hwang and **Judy Purvis** led the science experiment portion of the meeting. There were many laughs and some splashing as members, campers and their families participated together in the "diver experiment" at each table.
