# PVP's 2017 NCCWSL PROJECT: AN UPDATE

PVP's Selection Committee which is comprised of Judith Jacques Hind, Elayne Nahman, Susan Negrete and Nancy Rayner is pleased to announce that this year's project to select two Marymount California University (MCU) students to attend AAUW's prestigious National Conference for College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL) was successfully completed in March.

When their budget allows, MCU contributes funds to send additional students to the Conference. This year two additional students, plus Kim Hernandez (Student Life Advisor and PVP branch member), will attend on behalf of MCU.

In a joint meeting along with MCU advisors, Susan Garman and Kim Hernandez, the PVP Selection Committee interviewed the 10 MCU application finalists on March 22, 2017 in which four finalists were selected. In addition, one graduating MCU senior will join the group, using her own funds to pay registration fees and travel costs. Both funding groups are pleased that a total of 6 MCU women will participate in the 3 days of NCCWSL speakers, workshops, and activities.

On April 10<sup>th</sup>, MCU hosted a luncheon for the 2017 NCCWSL attendees, their parents, the PVP Selection Committee and several young women who have previously attended NCCWSL to meet and discuss the upcoming Conference. There was lively conversation and excitement – for many of these young women it will be the first time they have traveled alone; have flown on an airplane, or have been involved in large campus dormitory life. The past attendees reported life -changing experiences and emotionally charged moments of gratitude for their support. Like the Tech Trek Project, the NCCWSL scholarships that PVP provides help lift and change young women's lives.

The 5-year NCCWSL endowment was established by PVP member Patricia (Trish) Dilligan, and is a legacy to her dedication and service as a Trustee on MCU's board. The PVP branch contributes funds to ensure that 2 young women per year attend NCCWSL.

AAUW Annual Recognition Luncheon was held on April 1, 2017 at the Red Onion Restaurant. This year's Status of Women's Award was given to Ann Shaw, local businesswoman, philanthropist, AAUW member and former Mayor of Rancho Palos Verdes. The branch recognized Shaw's leadership and commitment to a variety of community affiliations on the Peninsula; she has served as president of Peninsula Seniors since 2009 and as the Treasurer of the Palos Verdes Peninsula Village since its inception in 2014. She is also engaged with the League of Women Voters and serves as a local AARP Tax Aide coordinator.

Also recognized were four of our AAUW Members as Named Gift Honorees in appreciation for their significant contributions to the AAUW mission and the success of our branch. This year's honorees are Elayne Nahman, Louise Chao, JoAnn DeFlon, and Nancy Rayner. They joined the Branch in 2013-14 and jumped right in.



#### Louise Chao

Has chaired or co-chaired the branch Exploring Science project for 3rd-5th grade girls scouts for the last four years. Louise saved the program from extinction in 2013 with the help of her daughter, Aimee, who is a program alumnae and now in high school. They revitalized the program demonstrating to new groups of young girls that STEM careers are exciting options for women and that science related activities can be fun.
