Sherry and her academic career

Sherry has outstanding academic credentials. She has a doctoral degree in Historical Theology, magna cum laude designations attached to her degrees and a Phi Beta Kappa membership. And she earned her Ph.D. at Drew University while taking care of her two small children!

After relocating in Palos Verdes, Sherry taught for 10 years at Cal State Northridge and Cal State Long Beach. At Northridge she was a member of the Religious Studies Department. She was very much part of the development of the Women Studies curriculum.

Sherry and her husband Bill traveled twice to faraway places as faculty members of the University of Pittsburg Semester At Sea program. While at sea she taught courses on *Religions of the World* and *Women and Sexuality*.

Sherry as Advocate ...

Sherry was the Executive Director of the Adolescent Pregnancy Childwatch for six years, working with over 100 public and private agencies in LA County. The main goal of the organization is the reduction of adolescent pregnancies and the provision of counsel and support to teen mothers. The list of her reports and presentations regarding the subject is impressive.

Because of her expertise, Sherry has served as consultant to a number of organizations such as the YWCA of Greater Los Angeles, and the Children's Defense Fund among others.

Sherry as Administrator...

For over ten years Sherry held high level administrative positions at USC. As Dean and Vice Provost for Continuing Studies, she developed curricula and alumni services. She was also Vice President/Executive Director of the General Alumni Association.

Sherry as Volunteer...

Throughout her life Sherry has given her talents to a variety of organizations, many of which support women's causes such as Rainbow Services, and Los Angeles Women's Foundation.

One of her most generous volunteer activities is Hospice visitations. She provides companionship and because of specific training, she performs "compassionate touching massage" to those requesting it.

Sherry as AAUW-PVP leader....

Sherry became our leader (Chair) in 2012 right after our "transition" period. She was the ideal person to guide us in formalizing the new branch leadership model.

She opened her home to informal meetings where we discussed new ideas and projects. The International Women Salons, the Palos Verdes Peninsula Village and the revival of Tech Time as Exploring Science took place during those meetings.

As a fairly new member, Sherry was active in refocusing the branch on the AAUW mission, and WAWA (Who Are We Anyway) was born. She continues to be the leader of this group.

She is always a thoughtful participant at Council meetings. As someone said, "When Sherry speaks we all listen."
