The AAUW National Board of Directors has voted to put three proposals for bylaws amendments before the membership. Voting will open on April 25, 2018, and close June 9, 2018.

The proposed amendments address creating three-year staggered board terms, opening board service to those outside of the AAUW membership, and eliminating the degree requirement for membership. Rationale and details for each amendment can be found on the <u>AAUW website</u>. All members will receive voting instructions in April.

NCCWSL Project Updates

On April 24, 2018 Bonnie Durling, Elaine Nahman, Nancy Raynor and Susan Negrete, PVP's Selection Committee for AAUW's National Conference for College Women Student Leaders, will meet the selected students and their guests at a campus luncheon hosted by Marymount CA College.

This is the fifth year of the PVP and MCU project collaboration, and the luncheon provides an opportunity for prior NCCWSL attendees to tell their stories, share experiences and answer questions from the newly-selected students.

In addition, MCU confirmed that Cimone Pernell, a PVP 2015 NCCWSL student, will graduate in May. PVP will send congratulations and an AAUW cord to wear at commencement, in addition to offering an AAUW one year Give-A-Grad-A-Gift membership.

Busy Legislative Session=Branch Advocacy Opportunities!

The California Legislature is gearing up for a busy session this spring and summer. With over 2000 bills introduced, the AAUW CA Public Policy committee and our advocate, Shannon Smith-Crowley narrowed our focus down to 31 pieces of legislation that fit AAUW's mission. While many worthwhile bills were introduced, as a committee, we try to focus on those areas where AAUW is an expert and often a lead- Title IX, Pay Equity and STEM. This year, there were several proposals in response to the #MeToo campaign and sexual harassment which we will be watching.

As the session unfolds, it might be helpful to have branches meet with their local legislators to discuss support of these bills. Shannon will determine what and who and then we will contact the branch in the legislator's area. Advocacy efforts might include phone calls or emails, or an office visit. There are tools on AAUW's website teaching how to have a successful visit and the Public Policy committee is available for coaching and ideas. We will also be following up on the ideas from the advocacy plenary at the state convention and working to create a database of who we know in public office to help with our collective advocacy efforts. We look forward to working with you and your branch!

IN REMEMBERANCE



Janet Smith, one of our "founding mothers" passed away this past March. Janet became a member when our branch was born in 1957 and soon participated in or headed important projects such as the Battered Women Project which eventually led to the founding of the San Pedro Rainbow Services. Janet was branch president from 1978 to 1980 and recipient of the Status of Women Award in 1980.

We consider Janet a legendary figure, not only because of her AAUW-PVP contributions but also for her outstanding work with the Palos Verdes community as Li-

brary Trustee, Secretary of the PV Art Center Board, member of the Coordinating Council, the Norris Theater, and Help the Homeless Help Themselves.

Despite all her accomplishments, we think that Janet would prefer us to remember her from something she wrote and her family quoted in her memorial:

"On my 50th birthday, I made a conscious decision to think the best of people and put the most positive construction on their actions. It has not always been easy, but with God's help, I feel I have become more patient, more empathetic and more compassionate."

Janet was in poor health for the last few years but always kept in touch with AAUW and our activities.
