Interview with Assembly member Muratsuchi

Legislative Interviews 2020

In April, a team of AAUW members interviewed Assemblymember Al Muratsuchi (66th District) via conference call. Our interview team: Denise DeVenuto, Nancy Mahr, Elayne Nahman, Nancy Rayner.

Nancy Mahr spoke about AAUW and our mission and described our advocacy work.

Assembly member Muratsuchi shared his observations and concerns relating to the coronavirus pandemic, including increased testing capacity and more protective equipment. He commended Governor Newsom and Mayor Garcetti for their leadership in addressing the crisis. He also stated that measures related to the virus would take priority over other bills when the Legislature returns for duty. He noted that his Torrance office is overwhelmed with people who have lost businesses or are unable to pay their rent or mortgages. He noted that this is not just a health crisis, but an economic crisis which is the worst since the Great Depression. This crisis has resulted in a tremendous downturn in our state budget.

Denise DeVenuto commented on the need for testing on college campuses as students return to school in the fall.

Nancy Rayner asked about domestic violence and the pandemic. Muratsuchi noted that this has increased around the world during this time. His office is aware of the issue.

Nancy then asked about AB 2762, a cosmetics safety bill authored by Muratsuchi. He explained that the bill has strong opposition from the cosmetic industry. The industry argues that they can't keep out trace amounts of asbestos. He said he is planning to push (this bill) forward.

Elayne Nahman raised AB 973 which would require private employers of 100 or more employees to file an annual pay data report which would highlight any differences between employees – for example men and women. He said that he supports this bill.

Denise DeVenuto spoke about Tech Trek and the Tech Trek Alumnae Group (TTAG). Assemblyman Muratsuchi said he is well-acquainted with Tech Trek. Denise explained that the girls who were selected for this summer's camps will not be able to attend camp, but they will be welcome to participate in TTAG activities.

Assembly member Muratsuchi's office is always available to help with any concerns residents may have.

Branch Vote by Survey - Results

The proposed slate of Branch Officers for 2020-21 was unanimously elected by members who voted on the survey vote sent out June 6. Our South Bay group of high school Tech Trek Alumnae (TTAG) will hold a virtual Tech Trek experience for the 2020 Tech Trek candidates from Palos Verdes, Beach Cities and Torrance branches. South Bay TTAG has been holding Zoom meetings to plan the virtual camp which will be held one week in July.

So far, our plans include a Marine Science class taught by Scott Simon, UCSB professor and director of the REEF program, and a long-time teacher at UCSB Tech Trek camp. We have also invited a chemistry teacher to teach a class. Recorded webinars which will be pre-screened for appropriateness, will also be utilized. Possible topics include speakers regarding careers as engineers, doctors, space exploration with NASA, as well as gender bias in certain careers such as engineering, and a virtual tour of two STEM companies.

PVP Tech Trek Status Update

I'm happy to provide a bit of good news for our 2020 Tech Trek girls. UC San Diego camp partner Qualcomm offered to work with AAUW to pilot a smaller virtual robotics camp for 40 girls to be held this August 3-7. UC San Diego Camp Director Mary Isaac worked with Qualcomm to offer **STEMinists Making Change** to the 2020 girls selected to attend the San Diego camp, including the 4 girls selected by PVP. Two of our girls applied for the opportunity to participate in the random drawing and Buenalee J. was selected. Mary also provided a list of other virtual opportunities that can be explored for free this summer by the other girls selected to attend UC San Diego. I will provide this same information to all our 2020 girls selected for the other camps. Our thanks to Mary for working to provide a STEM camp experience to our girls.

We still have the reservation at Hesse Park for October 4, 2020 as originally planned for Celebrate Tech Trek. If it is possible to honor our girls in person, we will have a place and time to do so. We want to recognize and present each girl a certificate for being selected in a competitive process. However, it may not be feasible to have such a large group gathering so I will advise you of the final plans by July 20th.

This has been a challenging year for Tech Trek and there are still many challenges ahead. More information about the program for 2020/2021 is expected by early September so we will have a better idea of what to plan for. I look forward to connecting with our dedicated Tech Trek Committee for the upcoming year.
