NCCWSL PROJECT UPDATE By Elayne Nahman



So much has happened since our last newsletter. At that time, we reported that in late July, 2021 Marymount signed an agreement to merge with Saint Leo University located in St. Leo, Florida. The merger faced an impediment in December, 2021 when it didn't receive regulatory approval from the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges, so both parties dissolved the partnership. On April 22, 2022 it was announced Marymount California University would permanently close later this year due to financial difficulties. The last day for the school's 500 students and 140 employees will be August 31, 2022. Marymount officials have begun transitioning students to other colleges and universities for the fall semester.

A great development occurred when it was announced on May 6, 2022 that Marymount California University would be partnering with the University of La Verne to help Marymount California students complete their degree programs. Under an approved agreement, Marymount California undergraduate and MBA students will be able to smoothly transfer into the University of La Verne and be guaranteed specific benefits related to admission, financial aid, and housing including:

- Guaranteed admission and expedited application process: Marymount California students in good academic standing will be guaranteed admission subject to the policies in the University of La Verne Catalog. Students will submit an application and transcripts and the University of La Verne will waive the application fee, the personal statement, and the letter of recommendation.
- Matched Marymount California scholarship: University of La Verne will honor Marymount students' current scholarship packages, ensuring they do not face a cost burden to transfer.
- Guaranteed housing in University of La Verne residence halls: Any Marymount California student who applies to live in the residence halls will be guaranteed a placement through June 15, and after that will be offered housing on a space-available.

Transfer credit and a path to graduate on time: In addition to having more than 50 majors to choose from, the University of La Verne offers students the ability to create their own degree path and will offer 1:1 advising support.

In addition to supporting current Marymount California students, the agreement also includes guaranteed admission and other benefits for regularly admitted incoming freshmen, MBA, and transfer students who had not yet had a chance to begin their studies at Marymount California.

As sad as the closure of Marymount California University is for so many, University of La Verne's generous offer brings so much relief that the students will be able to continue their education as envisioned.

MAY BRANCH MEETING

Twenty-seven Branch members enjoyed the program "What Color is Your Personality" which was presented by our member Connie Leach. Connie shared the True Colors program, a personality test designed for people to get a sense of their own personality and that of others. There are four colors: Blue, Green, Gold, and Orange, each with respective attributes. Blue is nurturing; Green is non-conformist/visionary; Gold is organized and rule-following; Orange is active and spontaneous. We each identified our own color. Each color brings something to an organization. If everyone were the same color, the organization wouldn't be effective.

Kathy Ford shared the latest Tech Trek information. This year we have 18 girls attending residential camp and three attending virtual camp.

Nancy Mahr announced that Kathy Ford is this year's Status of Women honoree.

Yes, it's that time again! Your current membership expires June 30, 2022. For the second year, you will be able to renew your membership online, but the process has changed. The new system is called the AAUW Community Hub.

You can review and update your information, select a primary branch if you are a dual member and use your credit card to renew and pay all branches at once. If you prefer, you can still renew by check using the Renewal Form found in this newsletter.

To renew online, go to www.aauw.org and click Log-in in the top right corner. Then click on Forgot Your Password? (Near the bottom of the page). You will receive an e-mail with a link to reset your password.

After you reset your password and log in, scroll down and click the Renew button:

Select CA 0078 for Palos Verdes. (If you select more than one, choose a primary branch.)

Online state? Yes, select CA
