## LEGISLATIVE INTERVIEW

Each spring, our Branch sets up an interview with one of our state or federal legislators or their staff. In July 2022, a group of AAUW members met via Zoom with Latreshia Hamilton, a staff member from Congress member Ted Lieu's Washington Office. We asked about several federal bills and issues of importance to AAUW and our mission.

### Women's Health Protection Act (HR 3755)

(Protects right to abortion services)

Congressman Lieu supports this measure and has voiced his support in the House. The bill is held up in the Senate.

### Ensuring Women's Right to Reproductive Freedom Act (HR 8297)

(Protects right to travel to access reproductive and abortion services)

Lieu also supports this measure.

### Paycheck Fairness Act (HR 7; S 205) from 2019

(Expands Equal Pay Act of 2010; non-retaliation protection re. discussion of salaries; employers cannot use salary history in hiring process; creates task force to investigate issues)

Bill passed in the House but did not pass in the Senate.

Lieu signed on as a co-author of this measure.

### ERA

Lieu supports this and signed-on to the bill. Current progress is slow as momentum was overcome by other issues – e.g., Covid, Ukraine.

### Homelessness

Lieu is working on measures to help the homeless population – especially regarding veterans. He does not think vouchers have been well-managed. There are not enough spaces available.

### Paid Leave

Lieu supports paid leave for child and family care, including Covid.

### Public Input to Legislators

Notes and calls to legislators are effective ways to share your views. The Two-Minute-Activist/Action Network programs are a good channels to reach your legislators.

We told Latreshia about Tech Trek and asked if the Congressman might be interested in coming to one of the camps on opening day and greeting the campers. She advised to contact the office next spring regarding his participation.

On the ballot: Federal representatives – House and Senate; California state offices; County offices; local city, school board, library board, and special district offices; 7 State ballot measures and 1 (one) County ballot measure.

## WHEN WOMEN VOTE WE CHANGE THE CONVERSATION

Since 1881, AAUW has been a leading voice promoting education and equity for women and girls. AAUW encourages women voters to get involved in the political process and gain a better understanding of the impact legislative action can have on our lives.

The recent US Supreme Court *Dobbs* decision on abortion has stimulated action in many states across the nation, including California. Our legislature passed and Governor Newsom signed AB1666 which will enable a woman coming into California to receive an abortion to be protected from lawsuits originating in her home state. This bill was co-sponsored by AAUW CA! A further step protecting a woman's right to make personal medical decisions is a Constitutional Amendment, Proposition 1, which will be on the November 8 ballot. It would amend the California Constitution to prohibit the state from denying or interfering with an individual's reproductive freedom in her most intimate decisions, which includes the fundamental right to choose to have an abortion and the fundamental right to choose or refuse contraceptives. AAUW CA supports this Constitutional Amendment.

Congressional races are particularly important this November. Redistricting after the 2020 Census has changed the boundaries of many Congressional districts. In the current partisan climate, we need to be aware of what is at stake in both our national and state upcoming elections. Your current member of Congress may no longer represent you – be sure to become informed soon on the candidates for Congress in your district. As you sort through all this, please reflect on priority issues affecting us, our daughters, and granddaughters, and evaluate candidates' positions on these issues.

**So, how did we do in 2022?** 16 of the girls we selected attended Tech Trek camps this summer – 15 to residential camps and 1 to virtual camp. The girls wrote heart-felt thank-you letters to our branch about their wonderful camp experiences which is why we all support this program. Thanks to the 2021-22 Tech Trek Committee for all their work in accomplishing this – all virtually.

Sending 16 girls to camp is a solid accomplishment, but at the same time, it was disappointing that 7 of the 23 girls selected cancelled, with 6 of the 7 cancellations coming from Wilmington Middle School. I spoke to Mrs. Rodriguez, who is a very dedicated supporter of the Tech Trek program at Wilmington MS. She's not sure why there were so many cancellations, but we will be working to see what can be done during the selection process to improve the attendance ratio for this very important school partner. Covid continued to be a challenge and several residential camps ran below capacity as a result, but we want to make sure our processes encourage attendance.

As always, contact me if you have any questions, need more information, or want to join the PVP Tech Trek Committee. We will begin planning for the 22/23 Tech Trek year in the fall and you can be a part of it. The Tech Trek Committee works closely with the lead middle school coordinators at each school to select girls to apply and interview for camp, helps girls prepare for camp with an orientation, and celebrates their success after camp. This is a program that changes lives – and gives you an opportunity to make a difference.

**HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO US!**

In 1957, when our branch was founded, we played basketball on half a court! There was no Title IX to open athletic opportunities for girls. Women were beginning to go to college in larger numbers, but few were thinking of careers. By 1960 only 3.5 percent of lawyers and 2 percent of business executives were women. We were a few years away from Title VII of the Civil Rights Act (1964) that would bar employment discrimination. In some states, women could not make contracts, including wills, or sell property, control their own money, or even get credit cards in their own names. Reproduction rights or access to oral contraception was not known. The FDA approved the first birth control in 1960 and five years later, the Supreme Court said that states could not prohibit married women from buying contraceptives. Domestic violence was not something one acknowledged, let alone openly dealt with. Since 1881 AAUW has been in the battlefields in Washington and Sacramento fighting for all these rights and many more.

Much has changed but much has yet to be accomplished. As a branch we will continue to support and celebrate AAUW's accomplishments, its groundbreaking research, educational funding, and public policy advocacy. We will continue to support the Mission with our membership, our donations, and very importantly with our local projects: Tech Trek, TTAG and NCCWSL
