AAUW'S NEW PROGRAM FOR HIGH SCHOOL GIRLS - GOV TREK

AAUW CA is introducing a new program called Gov Trek. The goal of Gov Trek is to address the shortage of women in the halls of power by inspiring high school junior and senior girls to consider careers in public service and elected office. During this virtual program, students will interact with women legislators, explore career options, and learn about the inner workings of a political campaign, culminating in a group competition to create a realistic campaign simulation.

High School Junior and Senior girls can apply to participate in Gov Trek. 150 girls statewide will be accepted in the first group program. They will be accepted on a first-come-first-served basis. The online registration deadline is Jan 14, 2023. The program is free to participants and will be conducted via Zoom.

Time frame: January 28 to March 26, 2023.

Program times: There will be 5 sessions, 2 hours each. Sessions will be on Saturdays. Sessions will cover politics, city, state and federal government, and campaigns for office.

Presenters: Current female legislators or their staff. Career women from AAUW

TECH TREK It seems like we just finished celebrating the 2022 Tech Trek campers – and we did! But the planning for the 25th season of Tech Trek, has begun. Tech Trek started with one week at Stanford in 1998. Thanks to all of you Tech Trek supporters at PVP and branches across the state, for providing a STEM camp experience to almost 14,000 young women since


The Tech Trek Committee met on December 7 to discuss what to expect for Tech Trek in the new year.

Things to know about 2023:

- The current plan for 2023 includes 7 weeks of residential camps 4 weeks, including UCSD, in Southern California, 3 weeks in Northern California, plus one week of virtual camp available for all branches.
- We will have another new software system to learn, but this one should be permanent. Camp Docs is recommended by the ACA (American Camp Association) and can provide the support we need to create forms, in English and Spanish, and processes for camper selection, camp registration and data capture for tracking our campers over time. They also provide training and access to our branch data, which is a big plus for those interested in taking on a leadership role at PVP Tech Trek.
- Our Branch Leadership Co-Chair will be sent a link to complete the annual Tech Trek Branch Participation Memorandum of Understanding this month to confirm the number of 2023 camperships PVP is requesting. It must be completed by January 20, 2023. We will be notified in January the number of camperships allocated to PVP. The deadline for confirming or modifying camp reservations is March 1, 2023.
- Thanks to Rowie Wolf for her work on the year-end fund-raising campaign for Tech Trek. This allows us to continue to send our girls to camp, even with the expected increases in fees for residential camps.
- Camp Docs should be ready to accept camper applications in late January, but we will connect with our school contacts at Wilmington and Dana Middle Schools before then. So, February will be a busy month when we will be reading applications, interviewing, and selecting campers and alternates. We have used zoom the past 2 years to interview the applicants and may do so again. As in prior years, all volunteers for Tech Trek are required to sign the Annual Code of Conduct before the interviewing process begins. The form is currently on the AAUW-CA website under Tech Trek.
- The Tech Trek Committee discussed using School Coordinators/Co-coordinators at our 2 existing schools to manage the selection and follow-up processes needed to get our girls to camp. We have several volunteers for this role, and it can be expanded to cover any new schools we add to the PVP program. Prior to Covid, we reached out to 2 other schools in the area to implement Tech Trek programs - Dodson MS in East Rancho Palos Verdes, and Fleming MS in Lomita. We can again reach out to them to join in 2024. • There's more information currently on the AAUW-CA website at https://www.aauwca.org/tech-trek-forms-documents/.
